AVAILABILITY AND LOCATION OF SECURTY PERSONNEL

Hope International University's Campus Safety provides 24-hour service to protect and aid the University community. Students and employees can report all in-progress suspicious or criminal acts, all fire, and medical emergencies in person at the Campus Safety Office at the entrance to the Titan parking lot or by calling 714-519-9127. In case of emergency please call 911 for Fullerton Police assistance. We encourage all crimes to be reported to Campus Safety or the Vice President of Student Affairs office #209, phone 714-879-3901 ext. 1211, in the Lawson/Fulton Student Center.

To Report a Crime:

- Provide your name, telephone number and location
- Give clear and accurate information
- Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel
- DO NOT HANG UP! Follow the instructions of the officer

HIU has several blue light phones located in our parking lots. Each phone can call Campus Safety or the Fullerton Police dispatcher. When one of the buttons is pushed, the blue strobe light flashes from the top of the phone tower, and your choice is notified immediately. An officer is sent to the location of the telephone. Additionally, a "virtual" blue light tile is available in the HIU mobile app that will connect callers directly to a Campus Safety officer. If possible, try to describe the emergency to the dispatcher or Campus Safety. Any person who needs help, sees something suspicious, or notices someone who needs help should activate a blue light phone that allows the person to speak directly with the Police dispatcher or Campus Safety.

SPECIAL SAFEGUARDS FOR FACILITIES OR ACTIVITIES

Security of and Access to Campus Facilities

All campus facilities are key-accessed, and most are open daily for scheduled campus community use. The Alpha and Omega residence halls are proximity card accessed and are locked 24 hours a day. Campus Safety is responsible for the security of all campus facilities. Personnel perform daily building lockups of most of the campus buildings and monitor all maintenance issues in campus lighting, door locks, and general environmental safety in conjunction with HIU's Operations Department. Regular inspections of campus lighting shrubbery and walkways are conducted.

SECURITY AND CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS

Hope International University has developed an annual educational campaign consisting of presentations that include the distribution of educational materials to new students, participating in and presenting information and materials during new employee orientation, and to other campus groups annually. ACTIONS TAKEN IN THE LAST 18 MONTHS TO INCREASE SAFETY

- 1. All security officers completed a professional development workshop hosted by the Higher Ed Investigations & Consulting (HEIC) firm and facilitated by the Chief of Police, California State University Long Beach.
- 2. Transitioned from a homegrown system to track incident reports and daily logs to Guard Pro, a best-of-breed suite of Campus Safety and Security tools.
- 3. Refreshed all signage across campus to improve parking and traffic management. Amended our citation policy to include monetary fines.
- 4. Published a whitepaper outlining substance abuse policies and mandatory drug testing protocols.
- 5. Conducted several pre-season workshops with high-risk student organizations to highlight Title IX and hazing policies and procedures.

CHANGES IN SAFETY PRECAUTIONS DURING THE NEXT 24 MONTHS

- 1. Continue searching and applying for Homeland Security and other federal and state grants to strengthen Campus Safety infrastructure.
- 2. Implement a mandatory drug-testing program in the HIU Athletics program.
- 3. Publish a whitepaper outlining student group misconduct policies and procedures.
- 4. Conduct a comprehensive security guard training in partnership with HEIC.
