

HIU students receive a transformative educational experience and are prepared to serve the Church and impact the world for Christ as exceptional servant leaders.



At last year's *Spirit of Hope* Gala, we honored several of our alums who serve around the world as missionaries, church planters, and evangelists. We couldn't possibly feature all the alums who serve globally, as over forty countries have been impacted by HIU alums over the past 96 years. These servant leaders are hard-working and often work for decades in very challenging villages, deserts, mountains, and in some of the poorest slums of Africa.

I want to take a risk and ask that you keep the following information to yourself, as there is some measure of peril in describing the amazing work going on in the Middle East. I can't disclose the country, but I can tell you about the good work **Doug** and **Shelly Kalestead** are doing through their organization, Iberoamerican Ministries (IAM).

Doug and Shelly were honored last year for their decades of service in South America, but what most people will never know is the work they do in the Middle East.

Hope is proud to reveal that we have been partnering with IAM for the last decade to provide instruction, curriculum, and guidance for the training of Christian pastors in a world that is almost entirely Muslim. Dr. Joe Grana, Dr. Phil Towne, and Dr. Carl Toney, along with one of our Board Members, Pastor Scott Martin, have all been an integral part of educating dozens of pastors in a region that so desperately needs to know the Lord. I have not yet been able to teach there, but I love that we have had these Hope faculty teach in person.

Churches are being planted and taking root in several countries. Only recently have the government leaders in a key country there acknowledged and permitted Biblically-based training. That approval can change at any time. This has allowed the work there to grow and flourish. What is happening there is similar to the secretive growth of house Churches in China during the second half of the 20th century. Once China lifted some of the restrictions on Christian gatherings, the world learned of millions of people who had committed their lives to Christ.

We are at the beginning of such a movement in the Middle East. Sharing this work with you is risky, so we aren't identifying cities, names, or details for safety reasons. As you would guess,





many people in these countries are very threatened by the gospel and all things Christian.

As President, I cannot be prouder of this work and am glad to pull back the curtain on this phenomenal endeavor that we are happy to be a part of. Please pray for the work in the Middle East, that it would spread and thrive, as well as for the safety of the faculty, staff, and students.

The other development I'm proud to unveil is our new Corporate Partnership program: BRIDGE.

Beginning this academic year, we are welcoming new students from three organizations. Our first three corporate partners are restaurant owners. It's exciting to welcome multiple Chickfil-A, Taco Bell, and Jersey Mike's locations to our new BRIDGE program.

BRIDGE allows employees of these locations to attend Hope at no cost. Hope provides a special Presidential Scholarship to cover any gap between the cost of tuition and financial aid that students qualify for. Over 1,100 employees will have access to lifechanging, Biblically-based degrees. These online degrees are a great fit for hard-working young adults who desire to earn their bachelor's degree while maintaining the demands of their job.

I am thrilled to partner with fine business leaders who see this as a great benefit for their employees. It really is a win-win, or even a winwin-win; wins for the employees, the Franchise Owner/Operators, and for Hope.

In time we will expand the model to other industries. Our heart's desire is to bring Christian higher education to students throughout California. I'm personally excited that many of the Taco Bell locations are in the middle of the state, where educational

opportunities are few and far between. Several times a year, my wife, Leslie, and I drive up Highway 395 to the Eastern Sierras. As we drive through the deserts, valleys, and mountains, I have long wondered what becomes of High School graduates in these small towns. With only a couple of exceptions, these small towns have no colleges for students to attend.



## **ALUMNI** in **ACTION**



After an extensive period of vetting highly qualified candidates from around the country, including in-depth interviews and a rigorous theological evaluation, the Board of Trustees of Christ Church of Oak Brook, IL, a multi-site campus, announced that the membership of Christ Church voted to call **Steve Carter (BA '02)** to serve as Lead Pastor.

Steve follows in the footsteps of Dr. Dan Meyer who retired in January. the Board of Trustees held a Special Meeting on Sunday, October 27, 2024, to call Rev. Steve Carter as our next Lead Pastor. Over 96% of the members at the Special Meeting voted to elect Steve as Lead Pastor of Christ Church effective upon the retirement of Rev. Dr. Dan Meyer in January 2025.

Steve joined the staff and began an orientation and onboarding process in November. After Dr. Meyer's departure on January 19, 2025, Steve became the Lead Pastor. Dan continues serve in an advisory role through the end of 2025.

Carter was the heir apparent to become the lead teaching pastor at Willowcreek Community Church in South Barrington, IL, upon the retirement of Bill Hybels, but chose to step down amidst developing news of Hybels' indiscretions and subsequent denials.

Steve is a dynamic speaker, podcast host, and the author of several books, including two bestsellers, *The Thing Beneath The Thing* and *Grieve, Breath, Receive* (available on Amazon).

Last April, several hundred HIU supporters, friends, alumni, Student Ambassadors, and staff converged in the Grand Ballroom of the Disneyland Resort Hotel for Hope International University's annual Spirit of Hope Concert & Awards Gala. The elegant evening of celebration, inspiration, and philanthropy highlighted HIU's ongoing mission and legacy of preparing students through Christian Higher Education to serve the Church and impact the world for Christ. The 2024 gala raised more than \$160,000 towards student scholarships.

HIU President Paul H. Alexander, Ph.D. ('84, '88), delivered the keynote address and unveiled the inaugural President's Alumni Servant Leader Award to Toby Yurek ('95) in honor of Toby's lifetime of exemplary public service, commitment to Christ, and support of Hope International University. Distinguished Alumni Awards were presented to Garrett Radford ('16), Kari Pel ('97), Dr. Richard Lopez ('00), Jim Price ('70), and Samuel Semanda ('18, 21). Three former student athletes were inducted into the HIU Royals Athletics Hall of Fame: Liam Hunt ('17 - Men's Basketball), Jazzmyn Esquivel ('19 - Women's Soccer), and Leigha Williams ('20 - Women's Soccer).

A panel of Deans from each of HIU's 5 Colleges fielded questions from **Dr. Steve Edgington,** Vice President for

Academic Affairs, sharing "A Dean's Eye View" of Christian Higher Education and highlighting the latest developments in their respective Colleges. Current HIU students **David Zacarias** ('24), who grew up in the Philippines, and **Amy Sanchez** ('25), who was born and raised in Mexico, each shared their poignant, personal testimony of how God led them to Hope, provided the financial assistance necessary for them to attend, and how HIU is equipping them for their chosen vocation. **Daunte Ferguson** ('23, '25) and **Emma Kisaka** ('25) served as the Masters of Ceremony.

Guests enjoyed musical performances by the HIU vocal ensemble, HopeSings!, as well as the HIU Worship Team, directed by alumnus and professor **Matt Thompson** ('03), Chair of Worship Arts. Prior to the gourmet dinner and program, guests gathered for a pre-event reception, enjoying hors d'oeuvres, live music, and a special photo op with Mickey Mouse.

After moving to the U.S., my parents got married and lived in a one-bedroom studio, where they only had one knife, a fork, a spoon, and a plate. They both worked extremely hard to ensure that my siblings and I have had every opportunity to succeed.

Ever since I was a little girl, my life has been full of suffering, childhood trauma, and moments in which my prayers to God have been full of tears and begging for the pain and chaos to stop. When my parents made the difficult decision to end their marriage; not only did it break our family, but it also broke my heart. As the oldest sibling, I had to step up and take care of myself and my little sisters. I spent countless dinner meals alone at what used to be a family dining table, holidays in my room alone, and moments crying to God, asking why.

Through adversity, I have grown deeper roots in my faith that God is good even when life is not, because pain and trials are only temporary, but God's love for me is eternal. See, I now have God-fidence, knowing that I when I can't handle things, He will.

I still get goosebumps when I think about how I ended up at Hope. A mentor of mine recommended HIU because she was enrolled in one of their master's programs, but I already had made my decision to attend another school, so I brushed her suggestion aside. But just days before my high school graduation, I received a

scholarship offer from HIU, so I applied to be a part of the teacher preparation honors program. When I got the news that I had been accepted, I changed my previous plans, and committed to Hope on the day of my high school graduation. Now, when I think about all that has unfolded for me at Hope, I have no doubt that it has all been part of God's plan for me.

The community at Hope has had such a positive impact on my life, from the Housekeeping crew and cafeteria workers to our President. My name is **David Zacarias.** I graduated in December with a degree in Music & Worship Arts.

It is quite a trip for me to be standing here tonight. Eight years ago, I was invited to attend Spirit of Hope with my church, and I've been to every Spirit of Hope since 2016! I never imagined I would be on stage sharing my story... but here I am!

Before I ever heard of Hope International University, the city of Fullerton, or even California, I only knew of my town in the Philippines: Belvedere, Cavite. My parents raised my sister and me there for the first five years of my life until we decided to broaden our horizons and explore better opportunities in a faraway land called the United States. We moved to Southern California we found a home in the city of San Gabriel, where we currently live to this day. It amazes me to think about the sacrifices, risks, and courage it took for my parents to leave everything that they knew and loved in the Philippines to give my sister and I the chance for a better life. I love you mom and dad!

Throughout middle school and high school I felt the Lord calling me to worship ministry, but also loved the idea of making money. So after high school, I attended a junior college in East Los Angeles to prepare for a career in Physical Therapy. At the same time, I accepted an internship at my church to learn more about worship ministry. After finishing the Physical

Therapy courses, I was lost and didn't know what to do. The only thing I had going for me was the church internship, so I had a conversation with our lead pastor, Guy Fox, about my desire to go into ministry. I'll never forget what he told me: "David, it's about time."

#### **WOMEN'S SOCCER:**

Fourth year Head Coach Scott Dement led the Royals to a program best 17-4-2 record and a run to the NAIA Ouarterfinals where they lost to eventual NAIA Champions University of the Cumberlands. The Royals won their second GSAC Regular Season Championship, second GSAC Tournament Championship, made their third NAIA National Tournament appearance and advanced to the final site for the first time after upsetting No. 6 Indiana Wesleyan at their place in the opening

round. Christiane Sundstrom was named an NAIA All-American after setting a new single season record for goals with 19 and tying the single season assists record with 10. Sundstrom was also named GSAC Player of the Year while Monique Cervantes, Ashlyn Edwards, Ryley Candelario, Sarah Ralston, Haley Slouka and Jaylene Valentin were named All-GSAC.

**MEN'S SOCCER:** Coach Joe Lurker guided the Royals to a program best 15-4-2 record and their first ever appearance at the

NAIA National Tournament Opening Round. The Royals finished third in the GSAC regular season standings but upset Vanguard in the semifinals and then beat The Master's to win their first ever GSAC Tournament Championship and punch their ticket to the NAIA Tournament. Jesse Mancilla, Luis Lira, Diego Lopez and Colm Cohen were named AII-GSAC

#### WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL:

The Royals finished the year in seventh place with a record of 9-16, 4-10 GSAC.

Season highlights included a five set win over Life Pacific, who were receiving votes in the NAIA Coaches Poll at the time and a 3-1 win over fourth place The Master's. Cassidy Koffroth was named All-GSAC.

CROSS COUNTRY: Emma Timmermans qualified for the NAIA National Championships for the third time and became the first cross country runner in Royals history to earn All-American honors after finishing 19th out of 333 runners. Luis Diaz qualified for the NAIA National Championships for the first time and finished 282nd out of 328 runners. The men's team placed fourth overall at the GSAC Championships and were led by Diaz who finished 15th. On the women's side Timmermans finished 4th at the GSAC Championships to earn All-GSAC honors as the Royals finished third overall.

#### **WOMEN'S BASKETBALL:**

The Royals finished the year in sixth place with a record of 14-11, 6-8 GSAC. Season highlights included a 70-68 win at third place The Master's and an 81-73 win at home against fifth place Arizona Christian. Shiane Talley was named All-GSAC

#### **MEN'S BASKETBALL:**

Coach Bill Czech was named GSAC Coach of the Year after leading the men's basketball team to the NAIA Tournament for the ninth time in program history after finishing the GSAC regular season in third place with a record of 21-10, 9-5 GSAC despite a season ending injury to scoring

leader Sebastian Castro just a few games into the season. The Royals upset No. 13 Northwestern College 79-76 in a double overtime thriller early in the season and would go on to upset No. 20 The Master's 67-65 before then falling to them again in the GSAC semifinals. Tristan Williams and Gavin Ramirez were named All-GSAC.

**GOLF:** Fourth year Head Coach Britney Sok was named GSAC Coach of the Year for the women for the second time after guiding them to their first ever GSAC Championship and first appearance at the NAIA Championships. Sarina Tayui and Cristen Legaspi received All-GSAC after helping the Royals defeat Vanguard in a playoff to win the title. Legaspi was 21st after day two at the NAIA Championships but didn't make the cut as the Royals finished 26th out of 30 teams. On the men's side Troy Schulz qualified for the NAIA Championships for the first time and finished tied for 27th. Schulz was also named All-GSAC after finishing tied for 12th overall helping the team to a sixth place overall finish. Schulz also won three straight individual titles during the season.

#### MEN'S VOLLEYBALL: The

Royals finished the year in fifth place with a record of 7-15, 2-8 GSAC. Highlights included two conference victories over Arizona Christian. Julian Zavala was named All-GSAC.

TRACK & FIELD: The men finished 6th at the GSAC Championships which was highlighted by Michael Ventura winning the 800 meter run with the second fastest time in school history. The men also finished third in the 4x800 meter relay with a school record time. For the women Emma Timmermans qualified for the NAIA National Championships and placed 18th in the 5000m. Timmermans also competed at the NAIA Indoor Track

and Field Championships finishing 13th and just missing the final.

**TENNIS:** The women's team finished in fifth place with a record of 6-11 but upset College of Idaho to advance to the GSAC Semifinals where they fell to top ranked Westcliff. Maldini Simic was named All-GSAC for the second year in a row. The men's team also finished in fifth place with a record of 8-13 but upset Jessup to reach the GSAC Semifinals before falling to top ranked Westcliff. Yugo Homma was named All-GSAC.

#### **BEACH VOLLEYBALL:**

Candice Palmer was named All-GSAC for the fourth year in a row while Rachel Miller also received All-GSAC honors as they helped lead the Royals with a record of 8-5 including helping upset No. 6 Vanguard and No. 7 The Master's. The team overall finished in fifth place with a record of 5-13, 4-6 GSAC.

**SOFTBALL:** Allie Puente was named GSAC Pitcher of the Year as well as NAIA and NFCA All-American Second Team as she led the NAIA with 316 strikeouts leading the Royals to third place in the GSAC with a record of 37-17, 10-10 GSAC. The Royals upset then No. 1 Oregon Tech and No. 2 Southern Oregon to start the season and then upset No. 7 Jessup in the GSAC Semifinals before falling to Vanguard in the final. For the second year in a row the Royals advanced to the NAIA Opening Round where they fell to eventual NAIA Champions No. 1 ranked Our Lady of the Lake. Emma McCraw also received All-GSAC honors for the second straight year.

**BASEBALL:** Larry Mahoney in his third year as head coach was named Rawlings NAIA Coach of the Year as well as ABCA/ATEC NAIA Coach of the Year and NAIA Ball Coach of the Year after leading the Royals to their first ever Avista NAIA World Series Championship and first NAIA Championship in school history. Mahoney was also named GSAC Coach of the Year after guiding the Royals to their fourth GSAC Regular Season Championship with a record of 45-16, 19-4 GSAC. The Royals would fall in the GSAC Tournament Championship but would bounce back to win the NAIA Opening Round Favette Bracket and advance to the NAIA World

Series for the second time in program history. The Royals became the fifth team in World Series history and first since 2006 to lose their first game and go on to win the Championship as they took down No. 13 Tennesse Wesleyan 14-6 in the final after upsetting No. 2 Georgia Gwinett in the semifinals. JJ Cruz was named MVP, David Rivera won the Gold Glove and Trey Seeley was named to the All-Tournament team. Cruz was also named NAIA First Team All-American and All-GSAC while David Rivera. Alex Moreno, Trey Seeley, Justin Drury and Josh Landry were also named All-GSAC and Amari Bartee was named GSAC Gold Glove.

#### **COMPETITIVE DANCE:**

The HIU Dance program finished 5th at the Midland Invitational and 3rd at the Doane Invitational. Highlights also included a 69-54.6 win over Lewis-Clark State College.

STUNT: In their third year led by Head Coach Kori Johnson the Royals went 25-6 and won the GSAC Stunt Tournament by going 4-0 and defeating Jessup 13-12. Kaitlyn Kelly, Mackenzie Flowers, Jamie Goldman and Angelina Castanon were all named to the All-GSAC team. The Royals would then advance to the STUNT National Tournament where they placed second.

## **Sebastian Castro** and **Shailissa Jarrett** were named our 2023-24 Cliff Hamlow **Champion of Character** Award winners.

**Sebastian Castro**, senior guard on the HIU men's basketball team, is a leader on and off the court, showcasing the NAIA's Champions of Character values. On the court he is the team captain, displays great sportsmanship, and respects every one of his opponents. Castro is one of the top players on the men's team starting nearly every game and was the second leading scorer last year while earning All-GSAC honors in the process. This season he has taken on a different role on the team after having his season cut short due to injury, but he is still there to motivate his team as a leader from the sidelines.

Sebastian displays great servant leadership through his activities in the community. The senior helps with cleaning trash and litter in his city through the partnership with his church, Crystal Cathedral. On campus, he showcases responsibility by being a life group leader where he leads his team by integrating God and basketball. Sebastian likes to incorporate the teachings of the Bible into ethical and inspiring motives that are enveloped in the game of basketball. A GSAC and NAIA Scholar Athlete, Sebastian is a leader in the classroom as well. Majoring in financial planning, Sebastian's future goals are to own his own firm and to play basketball professionally overseas.

**Shailissa Jarrett**, senior guard on the HIU women's basketball team, is the team captain, displays great sportsmanship, and respects all opponents. Jarrett is one of the top players on the

women's basketball team starting nearly every game and is the second leading scorer on the team.

Shailissa volunteers for local sports leagues at the Whittier Area Community Church. She also serves as the worship vocalist at her church and has volunteered with Union Creative and The Fathers House Orange County. She has volunteered for Sports Jam, an event featuring Christian pro athletes to encourage young athletes to get involved in sports. She was a featured HIU student athlete for their 2022 event alongside NFL, NBA, and professional soccer players. She was a lead vocalist for the 2023 event and has been invited back to fill the same role for the 2024 event. She serves as the basketball camp director for IE Rain camp coaching kids 7-12 years old.

On campus, she has been a small group leader for the last two years and a worship vocalist for Royals chapel. Academically, Shailissa is a Dean Honor Roll student and renaissance scholar. Undaunted by an opening game defeat, our resilient **HIU Royals Baseball** team reeled off five straight elimination victories in their historic run to become NAIA National Champions for the first time in school history. The Royals became the fifth team in NAIA World Series history to lose their first game and go on to win the Championship.

In the Championship game, the fourth-seeded Royals (45-16) rallied from an early deficit to win HIU's first ever Red Banner at the 67th Avista NAIA World Series in Lewiston, Idaho, beating the sixth-seeded Tennessee Wesleyan University Bulldogs 14-6. Senior second baseman **JJ Cruz** was named World Series MVP, and Senior shortshop **David Rivera** earned World Series Gold Glove honors. Junior pitcher **Trey Seely** was named to the All-Tournament team along with Cruz and Rivera.





Head Coach **Larry Mahoney**, who has been with the Royals baseball program since its debut in 2015-2016, was named NAIA Coach of the Year. Mahoney was an assistant for seven years before being named the Head Coach prior to the 2022 season.

## **CLASSROOM EXCELLENCE**

Sandy Kavanaugh, Mathematics

Sandy Kavanaugh, Assistant
Professor of Mathematics, was
honored with the 2023-2024 Rose B. &
Edgar B. McReynolds Faculty Excellence Award,
given each year to one full-time HIU faculty
member who exemplifies teaching-learning
excellence in the undergraduate classroom.
Presented during the Honors Convocation
Chapel each Spring, nominations were sought
from faculty and students. The final selection
was based on those nominations.

Professor Kavanaugh was commended by students and peers for careful class preparation and thoughtful teaching strategies geared to the specific students in each class, and for creatively engaging students in their own learning.

"She always finds interesting and effective ways to overcome student anxiety, explain course material well, and build student confidence in their own ability to learn difficult material, grow, and achieve success," one student remarked. "She

makes math fun and genuinely wants her students to improve their math skills and confidence." Another student said, "Professor Kavanaugh actively involves her students in the classroom and help them relate what they are learning to practical applications."

About the award: Dr. Paul McReynolds was beloved by several generations of students who learned New Testament from him at Pacific Christian College from the 1960s to the 1990s. Dr. McReynolds was famous for his patient, gracious teaching in Biblical Studies classes and his published Greek/English Interlinear New Testament, with which many of you have become familiar. He was also deeply committed to the teaching and learning process. He was commonly known to his students simply as "Dr. Paul."

When "Dr. Paul" retired, he funded a Faculty Excellence Award in the names of his parents, Rose B. and Edgar B. McReynolds.


# PUBLISHED! DR. FAY E. ELLWOOD

Dr. Fay Ellwood, HIU Associate Professor of English and English Department Chair, completed writing and publishing her first book, "Hawthorne's Prophets: The Bible and the Creation of American Literature" (now available on Amazon).

Nathaniel Hawthorne helped to establish and validate American literature by creating a mythology of America's origins - a mythology that features prophetic themes and figures. Just as biblical prophets emerge at the dawn of ancient Israel, Hawthorne's prophets emerge in stories of the beginnings of America. Thus, an understanding of biblical prophetic writings enhances the reading of these texts. In "The Minister's Black Veil," Reverend Hooper carries out a sort of prophetic symbolic action in the wearing of the black veil. In The Scarlet Letter, Hester Prynne is a prophet along the lines of Isaiah's Suffering Servant. She is rejected by her community, silently endures their criticism, but ultimately offers consolation to those who once rebuked her. In viewing Hester (and others) as prophet, we see Hawthorne crafting American literature as self-questioning, probing

its relationship with its original (often Puritan) ideals. In so doing, Hawthorne's prophets revise old ideologies, making new symbols for a new world. Grounded in biblical research, each chapter of Hawthorne's Prophets explores prophet figures and themes in a different short story or novel. Most of these stories - like much of biblical prophetic

literature - are retrospective: they look back to an earlier time, embodying the views and biases of a nineteenthcentury writer engaged in creating tales laced with shadows and questions of identity. A national literature must have origin storiesmythical roots that go backward as well as forward. Just as England had legends of King Arthur and Beowulf, Hawthorne's prophet stories shape the formation of American literature


